Ilocano Pronunciation Guide

Consonants are pronounced like the typical Italian ones except “**c**” which is pronounced like “**k**.” Double consonants must be pronounced individually. The consonants “**n**” and “**g**” when seen together in that order (**ng**) are considered one consonant and is pronounced as the “**ng**” in **song**. The consonant “**r**” is rolled. Take extra care to pronounce the ending consonants.

Vowels are pronounced as follows: “**a**” as in **armor**; “**e**” is the German schwa [ə] or the “**u**” in **fur**; “**i**” is the “**ee**” in **seen**; “**o**” is the “**aw**” in **yawn**; “**u**” is the “**oo**” in **spoon**.
